

Did you know...When it rains, water that washes across land enters our streams, creeks, and rivers completely untreated carrying pollutants it collects along the way? Pollution from stormwater runoff is a leading contributor to poor water quality in our local York County watersheds and beyond, including our much larger Chesapeake Bay Watershed.

Since 2018, the York County Master Watershed Stewards have organized the Street 2 Creek Storm Drain Art Project. Using an annual artist contest, project leaders use artwork around drains to raise citizen awareness and help educate the York community about the connection between storm drains, local waterways, and pollution.

The painted storm drains are woven throughout Center City York on both sides of the Codorus Creek. There are currently 18 painted storm drains - have fun finding them!

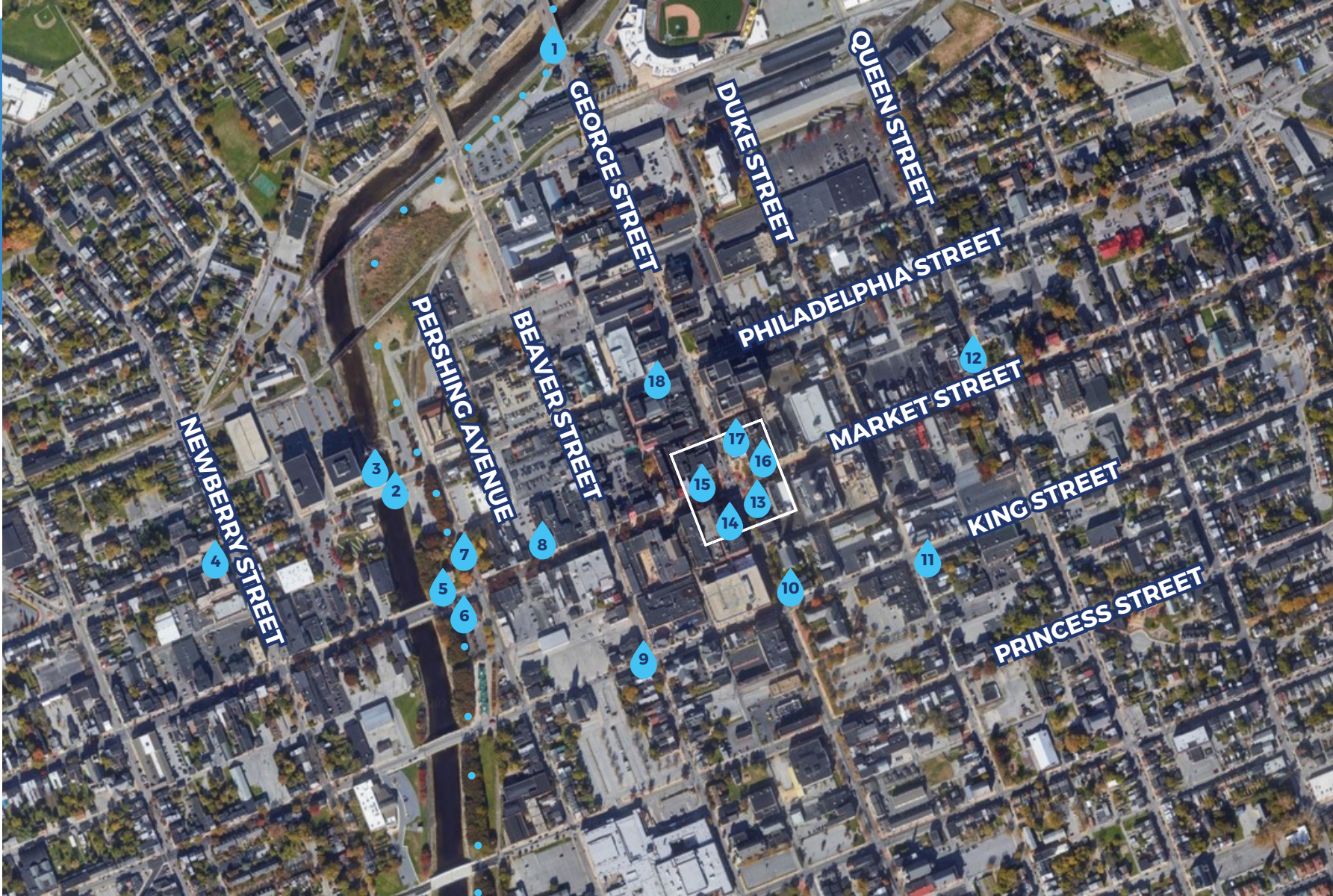

The best path from #1 to #2 is by use of the Rail Trail (dotted blue line).
